Jimmy was rescued from the wild and due to his inability to be rehabilitated, he has been transferred to his new home where he is the first of his species to live at the park, with several already residing at sister park, Wildlife Habitat Port Douglas.

Rainforestation Head Wildlife Keeper Kate Barnard said the new kid on the block was adored by passionate wildlife keepers and park quests alike.

"Jimmy is very social with the keepers, and often enjoys it when I give him a scratch. I'm happy to see that he is settling into his new home well," she said.

The 10kg Tree Kangaroo joins a range of other macropods in the park, including Eastern Grey Kangaroos and Swamp Wallabies.
